Since he left the Tunisian Ministry of Finance in December 2011, Mr Ayed has been an active public speaker promoting his vision for a prosperous Tunisia. He is a regular guest speaker of prestigious academic organizations and civil society forums. He continues to serve as director in the board of the Tunisian Caisse de Dépôt et de Consignation (CDC) that he founded in 2011; and as an independent member of the national joint committee in charge of supervising the reform of the financial system, and the restructuring of public banks. Mr. Ayed set-up a technology group in 2012 (the Vega-Group of Companies) to empower about 70 young Tunisian graduates and young professionals, many of them unemployed at the time, engaging them in IT career opportunities.



H.E. Hala Helmy El-Said

Hala H. El Said is recently (2017) nominated as Minister of Administrative Reforms and Economic Planning in the Government of the Egypt. Before that, she was the Dean of the Faculty of Economics and Political Science (FEPS) at Cairo University since October 2011 and a Professor of Economics at FEPS. She was also an Assistant to Cairo University President for Research and External Relations since September 2013. Dr. Hala serves as a member of the board of directors of the Central Bank of Egypt and Egypt's National Post Authority.
