The Euromed University organizes, in collaboration with the Euro-Mediterranean Network for Economic Studies (EMNES), a workshop on October 17th, 2019 on the theme of "Migration, Mobility and Development". This workshop will include the participation of experts, representatives from institutions, NGOs and researchers interested in the theme. The objective of the workshop is to provide a new vision on the realities and different parameters regarding an issue that is increasingly high on the international agenda.

Moreover, this workshop aims to stimulate an innovative and hopefully fruitful exchange of views on how to move from the negative perception of migration mainly in Europe to a more modern, future-oriented vision of mobilities that would be the outcome of a real Development policy.

"Under the impulse of His Majesty King Mohammed VI, Morocco is one of the very few Southern countries to have implemented a global and wide-ranged migratory policy mainly dealing with Sub-Saharan Africa. Furthermore, Morocco has been very active within the African Union to lead the way towards a unified and balanced position. Besides, the adoption of the Global UN Migration pact of Marrakech in December 2018 is an important step towards the edification of a new governance strategy of the various forms of circulation and migration, from one region to another, and from one country to another, throughout the world" stated, on this issue the President of the Euromed University of Fez, Professor Mostapha Bousmina.

The workshop will focus on four specific thematics to illustrate the need for a more global and concerted approach of migration and mobility, as well as the importance to balance policy making with a Bottom-Up approach. These thematics are Root Causes of Migration; Gender and Migration; North-South Migration and Mobilities; Migrants in the Labor Markets; Cultural Dialogue.






